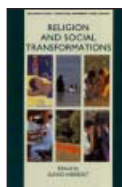

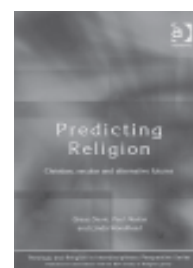
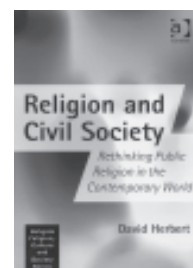
## An Introduction to Madhva Vedanta
